

New site, loaded Gutenberg plugin

Tried it out

Updated sample block plugin

Added more plugins

Added Advanced Custom Fields

Added a page template, a custom post type, a block template

# Spoilers: What will happen to post\_content?

#### **Front End:**

normal HTML, to be rendered as usual with CSS for the most part.

#### **Back End / dashboard:**

new editor UI, writes special but highly readable HTML into post\_content.

#### New and fresh:

- can easily create 'shared blocks'.
- can create custom blocks.
- can create 'block templates'.
